However this is not being done by some Christians who are ~~more~~ ^{more} strictly to the beliefs of God or Jesus which could be a product of their time.

On the other hand Christians may feel that the best way to live life is to follow the example set by Jesus. The presence of G-d emphasises to Jews how important and significant the Mitzvot are. ~~One of the~~ On the first tablet was 5 declarations identifies relationships ~~to~~ towards God and the 2nd tablet was 5 declarations about relationships with other people. The declarations towards God 'You shall have no other God's besides me' highlights how Jews should live their lives in the honour of God. and on the 2nd tablet 'honour your father and your mother' emphasised G-d's view on how ~~is~~ important all those around you are. Orthodox Jews follow the mitzvot very strictly and follow it with ~~every~~ everything they do throughout their ~~the~~ daily life. For example the mitzvot 'do not work on sabbath day' is viewed by Orthodox to do not work at all including driving, cooking or even turning a light switch as they believe it is the day of rest. They believe this is the best way to ~~follow the~~ live their lives as they feel they are following.

all of God's exact wishes for how they should live their lives. On the other hand the more relaxed Jews like the liberal Jews ~~etc~~ will consider the Mitzvot in their daily life but instead try to apply it to modern day. For example clearly they follow strictly the mitzvot 'do not kill' but others such as 'do not work on sabbath' they try to ~~be~~ compromise. For this is done by many Jewish doctors who work on the sabbath day by claiming they are doing this to ~~a~~ not break the other mitzvot. 'do not kill' which in their eyes is seen as the lesser of two evils. The Mitzvot is also viewed as the best way to live their lives as they as well as they believe they will be doing nothing wrong in the ~~view~~ eyes of God.

However non-Jews would feel that obeying the Mitzvot is ~~not~~ the way to live your life. This is because the Mitzvot has no significance to them and they do not see it as a word from God. Non-religious people feel the best way to live your life is through being yourself. Those with no religion may also believe that by obeying the Mitzvot as the way to live your life defeats the point of free will given by God.

As scientific knowledge expands, as religious beliefs and teachings are becoming much less important however there are still 7,000 faith schools funded by the state. The National Secular Society and others believe that the modernising view should be taken into consideration and that schools should just provide education that is necessary not any that is particular to a specific belief.

However some people for example Christians may disagree with this as they would say that churches pay 10% of the cost of some faith schools so they are actually paying for state school. They also believe that families should be able to send their children to a school in an area where they are surrounded by those of the same faith and brought up in an environment with similar beliefs and teachings. For them, God believes that for children to fully grow up in the faith Christianity it needed to be involve in all of the daily lives which is what their parents promise at baptism, so this is agreed that faith schools help bring up the child in an environment of their faith.
