Delivery guides are designed to represent a body of knowledge about teaching a particular topic and contain a clear outline of the content covered by the delivery guide. This includes:

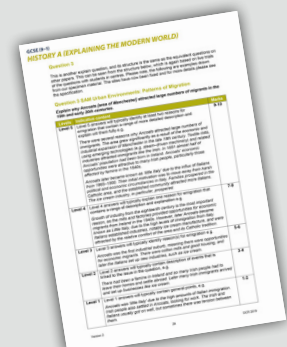
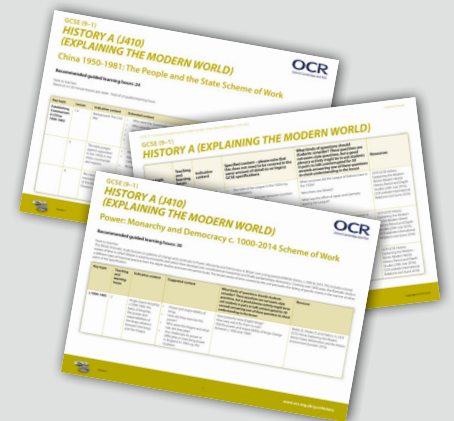
- Expert guidance on the key concepts involved.
