Following an Ofqual consultation, we have made changes to a number of our qualifications.

The changes are designed to reduce the pressure on teachers and students in the 2020/21 academic year, and to safeguard against ongoing public health concerns.

Overview of changes for GCSE Ancient History

Ofqual have confirmed that students taking GCSE Ancient History in summer 2021 will be examined on **both** period studies and **one** depth study.

We have split the J198/01 and J198/02 question papers into four papers. Each paper has a new component code. We have specimen assessment materials to show how the summer 2021 question papers will look to ensure your students will be familiar with this revised structure.

GCSE Ancient History for academic year 2020/21

Students must complete J198/11, J198/21 and **either** J198/12 or J198/22 to be awarded OCR's GCSE (9–1) in Ancient History in summer 2021.

- J198/01 is split into two papers: J198/11 The Persian Empire and J198/12 Greek depth study.
- J198/02 is split into two papers: J198/21 The foundations of Rome and J198/22 Roman depth study.

Teachers will need to decide whether to enter students for the Greek depth study paper or the Roman depth study paper.

- If you decide to enter students for the Greek depth study paper, you will need to enter J198 Option A.
 Students will sit J198/11 The Persian Empire paper and J198/12 Greek depth study paper in the first examination slot. In the second examination slot, students will sit J198/21 The foundations of Rome paper.
- If you decide to enter students for the Roman depth study paper, you will need to enter J198 Option B. Students will sit J198/11 The Persian Empire paper in the first examination slot. In the second examination slot, students will sit both the J198/21 The foundations of Rome and J198/22 Roman depth study papers.
