Post-16 Level 3 qualifications reform – quick reference guide

The new post-16 Level 3 qualification landscape

Following the review of post-16 qualifications and below, the Department for Education (DfE) has confirmed its aim of developing a new streamlined qualifications system for students aged 16 and over.

This quick reference guide is designed to provide you with a summary of what we know so far and what it means for you and your post-16 level 3 vocational curriculum. You can find more detailed information on this on our website. We'll update you as we know more about this and will continue to provide you with everything you might need as a result of these changes.

Summary

As a result of the reform, there could be two routes available for students. They could choose between:

- A Levels or a mixed curriculum of, typically, two A Levels alongside a vocational qualification, known as an Alternative Academic Qualification
- T Levels or they may wish to enrol in an apprenticeship.

Alternative Academic Qualifications will be developed in two cycles:

- Cycle 1 will include subjects that align with waves 1 and 2 of T Level roll-out with qualifications being funded from September 2025.
- Cycle 2 will include everything not covered in Cycle 1 and qualifications will be funded from September 2026.



Where are we now?

The Post-16 reform of qualifications at Level 3 will have an impact on the qualifications you teach from September 2025.

The new Alternative Academic Qualifications will become the only qualifications that exist alongside A levels and T Levels. The name has been decided by the DfE and the title 'Alternative Academic Qualifications' must be used, although further, exam board-specific titles can be used in addition, alongside the official name. They will replace Cambridge Technicals.

The new Alternative Academic Qualifications will not have the range of subjects or sizes that the Cambridge Technicals had. This has been decided by the DfE.

- There will be small, 1 A level sized qualifications allowed.
- They are deemed small as they will range from 150–420 Guided Learning Hours (GLH). An A level is 360 GLH.
- The first cycle (Cycle 1) of subjects will be submitted to the DfE in 2023, approved in 2024 introduced for first teach in September 2025.
- The second cycle (Cycle 2) of subjects will be submitted to the DfE in 2024, approved in 2025 introduced for first teach in September 2026.
- At the same time as above, funding for current Cambridge Technicals (both 2012 and 2016) will respectively cease, depending on whether the subject is in Cycle 1 or Cycle 2.
- There will be no large sizes of Alternative Academic Qualifications (720 GLH or 1080 GLH) apart from subjects where there are no T Levels (e.g. Sport and Performing Arts).
- The subjects where there will be Alternative Academic Qualifications have been determined by the DfE and is detailed in the guidance. If we propose any new subjects not currently offered as Cambridge Technicals, we will have to notify the DfE in February 2024.
- There will be no "Business" Alternative Academic Qualification. DfE Ministers have deemed that this subject is already well served by both an A level and a T Level and that offer will suffice.
- The DfE have indicated that only 1 Alternative Academic Qualification (typically alongside 2 A Levels) will be permitted, unless there are exceptional circumstances.
- No learner will be able to study 3 Alternative Academic Qualifications as their study programme.



What does this mean for Cambridge Technicals?

We've developed Cambridge Advanced Nationals, a suite of Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualifications designed to meet the DfE's criteria for Alternative Academic Qualifications and complement existing A Levels in post-16 programmes of study.

Cambridge Advanced Nationals will provide students with the practical and essential skills and knowledge they need to better prepare themselves for entry into higher education and university.

All our cycle 1 Level 3 180 GLH (AS Level size) and 360 GLH (A Level size) Alternative Academic Qualification Cambridge Advanced Nationals have been approved for inclusion on key stage 5 performance tables in England from 1 August 2025.
